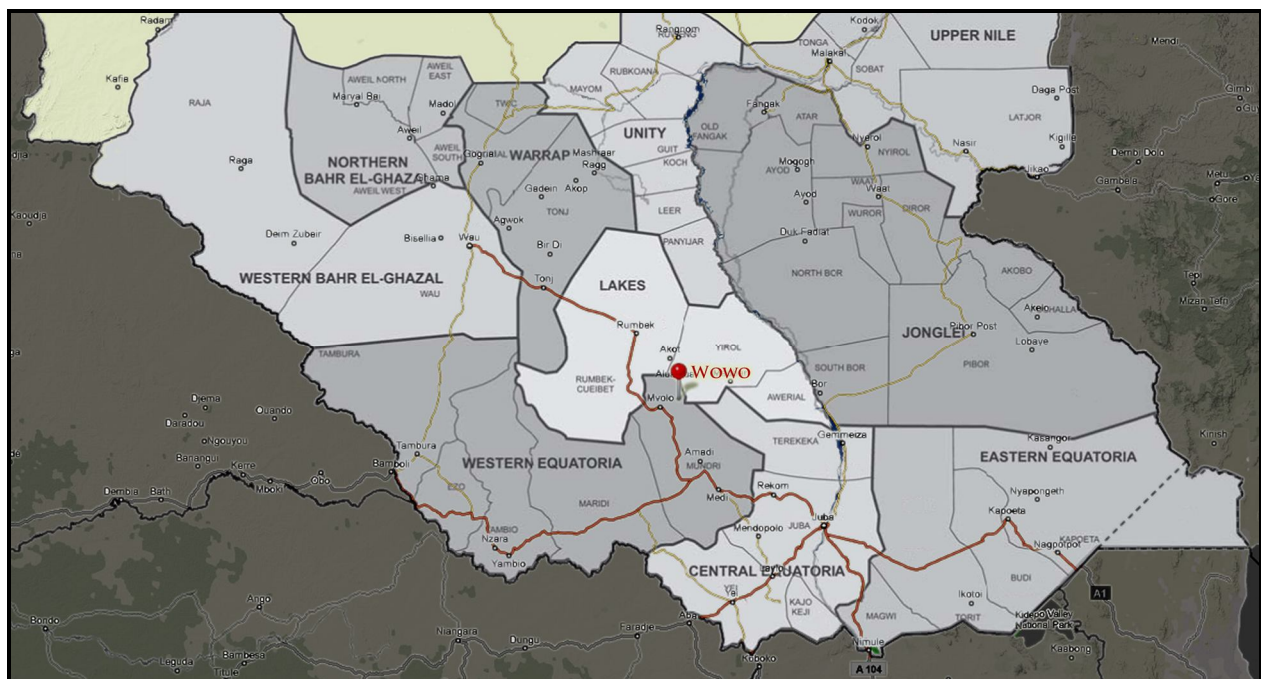

### Stated Project Purpose:



Project funding allows Aid Sudan to facilitate the construction of a school and clinic and the drilling of a water well in the village of Wowo, Sudan. With a current population of almost 8,000, the community is in dire need. The school is currently housed in a church, the clinic is in a run-down mud hut, and there is only one water well for the surrounding area. Partly due to its prime location along a main road, this village has seen major growth, but that only increases the severity of the need. It will now soon be powerfully transformed, as will the community around it.

### Project Update:

With construction well underway in Wowo, the villagers are rejoicing each day as they are seeing new hope brought to their community. Slight delays have occurred due to unpredictable factors, including impassable roads. However, those obstacles were overcome and the village now has an estimated completion date of this second quarter of 2010. Aid Sudan's partner in the region, the Sudan Inland Development Foundation, checks in with frequent updates of all the progress and reports that the work is going well.

Due to inherent challenges of obtaining pictures from the bush of southern Sudan, no current pictures are available. However, the completed buildings will look similar to the clinic building on the right (from another project). Strong, permanent buildings are replacing dilapidated and unreliable structures that could not accommodate the growing population. Real change is coming to Wowo, and soon the people will no longer lack access to basic resources. The village project will meet needs that have plagued the people for years, and at the same time will profoundly demonstrate God's love for them!
