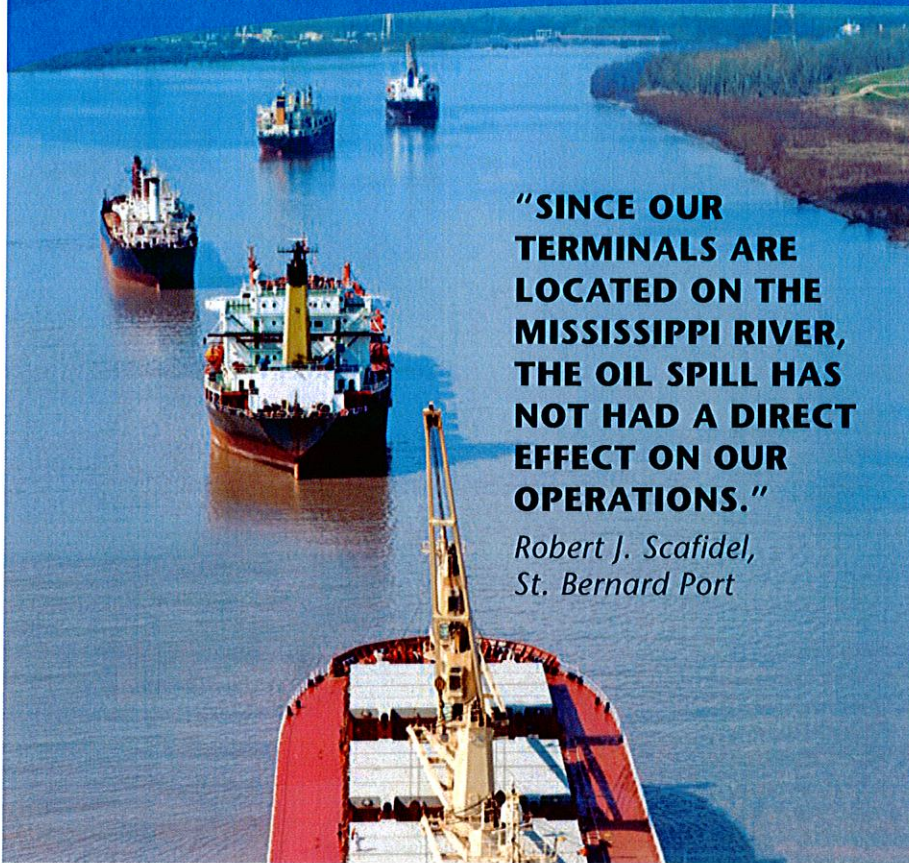

No port range is expected to reap more benefits from the expansion of the Panama Canal than the U.S. Gulf region. - Continued expansion of Bayport Container Terminal to meet market demand.
- Upgrades to Barbours Cut Terminal and Turning Basin multicargo facilities.

Gulf Winds Announces New Logo With Significant Business and Spiritual Meaning

HOUSTON, May 20, 2010 – Gulf Winds International released a statement by Vice President Todd Stewart on the symbolism behind the company's recent logo change.

"Our new logo is based on a Native American symbol for wind, the diamond. The diamond is green to maintain our original logo color and a sense of history. Wind represents movement, which relates directly to our core business of managing the transport and distribution of cargo. Early traders depended on the wind to guide their vessels, and our clients depend on us to properly handle, distribute and deliver their cargo.

A blue circle or globe of water is dropped over the diamond to represent international commerce. The globe will allow us to scale as our service areas expand over time. White lines surround the diamond and exit the logo from all four corners of the globe. They

represent international trade and point to our ability to move domestic and international cargo in all geographic directions.

The color selections of green and blue will also communicate our commitment to environmental stewardship. Our tag line remains 'The International Logistics Specialists,' in order to let our employees and clients know that although our logo has changed, our expertise and commitment to service will continue.

Biblical Meaning

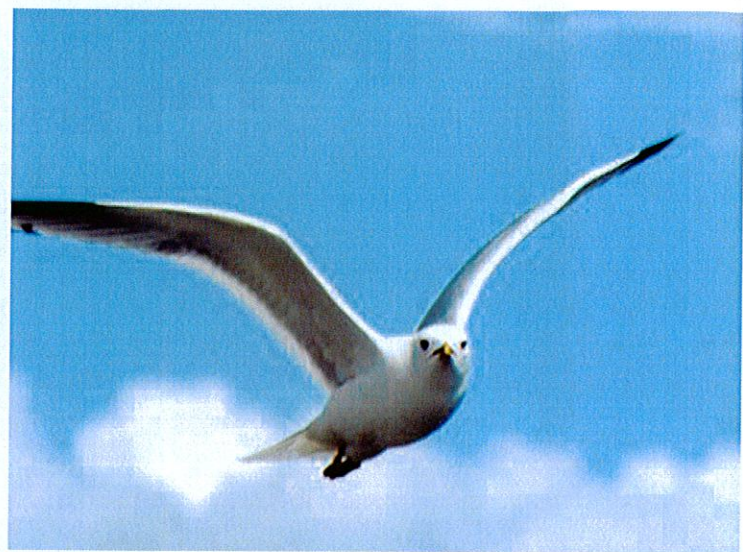

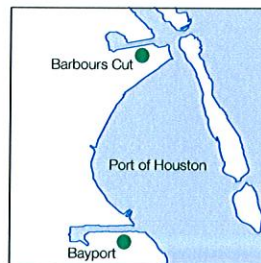


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
